#### Sun Smart

During Term 1 and 4 it is compulsory for children to wear the school hat when outside. There are many reasons why we make wearing hats compulsory, you just need to look at the statistics.

#### Statistics

- Over 4000 people are diagnosed with either melanoma in situ or invasive melanoma every year in New Zealand that is around 11 every day.
- It is the fourth most common cancer in New Zealand and accounts for nearly 80% of all skin cancer deaths.
- Around 300 New Zealanders die of melanoma every year.
- New Zealand and Australia have the highest melanoma incidence rate in the world.
- Although Maori and Pacific people have a lower chance of getting melanoma, they often have thicker, more serious melanomas.

Death rates are higher among men and appear to be increasing.

#### Lunch Boxes

We are noticing an increased amount of glad wrap and food packets being left around school after eating time. We are a zero waste school so all wrappings must go into the children's lunchboxes and be taken home for disposal. You could help your child by minimising the number of wrappers put into their lunchboxes. Boxes with compartments work well and mean that wrappers are not needed at all.






